From diagnosis to surgery and any ongoing treatment, the Breast Care Nurse works closely with the medical and surgical teams to provide quality patient focused care.

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Physical Needs

The Breast Care Nurse can provide supportive information and education to help minimise physical issues that may arise following breast surgery and/or treatment.



Emotional Needs

Every patient's adjustment to a cancer diagnosis is individual. The Breast Care Nurse is available to provide support and help you and your families navigate your breast cancer diagnosis and treatment.



Informational Needs

The Breast Care Nurse can help you with information on prosthesis, dressing skills, and many of the other supports and services that are available in the community.

The incidence of breast cancer in Australian women is increasing, with 1 in 8 women developing breast cancer before the age of 85 (Cancer Australia, 2014).

A diagnosis of breast cancer can cause significant emotional upheaval, with challenges that can be physical, psychological and functional (Cruickshank, S. et.al, 2008).
